
What is a Consolidated Plan?

- Required every five years by HUD to be eligible for federal funds;
- Assessment of needs in the community;
- Strategic Plan to meet the needs;
- Opportunity for the community to provide input and spending priorities for the next five years; and a
- Guiding document for allocating federal funds.

Purpose of the Consolidated Plan

- Plan and process that establishes a unitary vision for housing and community development activities
- Strategy for realizing HUD Program goals
- Application for federal funds
- Basis for assessing performance





 Prince George's County is the third most populous jurisdiction in the Washington Metro Region

 With a population of 858,539, only Fairfax and Montgomery Counties have larger populations.






Prince George's County Consolidated Plan: 2016-2020 Countywide Senior Population

(55 Years and older)

- Between 2000 and 2010 the population between 55 and 85 years plus grew by more than 20%.
- The 55 to 59 year old group grew by 4.8% between 2000 and 2010.
- The 65-74 year old group grew by 4.6% between 2000 and 2010.
- The group that experienced the most growth was the 85 and over age group which grew by 7% between 2000 and 2010.



Prince George's County: Poverty and Disability Among Veterans 18 Years and over

- Approximately 33% of the 18 and over population is between the ages of 18 and 34.
- Approximately 3.8% of the 18-34 group had income below the poverty level in the past 12 months.
- Approximately 39% of the 18 and over population is between the ages of 35 and 54.
- Approximately 2.7% of the 35 to 54 age group had income below the poverty level in the past 12 months.
- Approximately 15% of the 18 and over population fell between the ages of 55 and 64.
- Approximately 4.8% of the 55 to 64 age group had income below the poverty level in the prior 12 months.
- Approximately 12.6% of the 18 and over population is 65 and over.
- Approximately 3.6% of the over 65 had income below the poverty level in the prior 12 months.


Prince George's County Consolidated Plan: 2016-2020 Comparison: Ethnicity








Prince George's County Consolidated Plan: 2016-2020 Countywide Poverty Trends



Comparison: Educational Attainment for Population 18 to 24 Years









Comparison: Educational Attainment for Population 25 Years and Over













FY 2011-2014 CDBG Public Service Activities






FY 2011-2014 Public Facilities & Infrastructure











Housing Cost Burdened Households





Prince George's County Employers by Industry




