## **Local Impact Grant (LIG) Review Process and Awardees**

- Lori, TeQuilla, Evelyn, Toye reviewed applications
- Rated applications and provided comments and award recommendations
- Dr. Latimore reviewed all applications
  - Challenging to spread \$400,000 over 40 applications
  - Many of the nonprofits received \$5,000
  - Some programs were denied as there are free and existing services or is handled by other agencies
  - Many of the applications were poorly written and or copied from previous applications with little variation
  - Some indicated that they would be providing services outside the 6-mile radius so were not awarded any funds
  - Consider funding fewer nonprofits in the future to provide more money to better support and increase community impact versus small amounts that may not ensure programming
    - 10-15 awardees
- Will work with Kanika to review the LIG timeline
  - Need a minimum of 3 weeks to review the applications
  - o Possibly have the grant workshop in January in order to adjust application due date
- Requested a letter from Deputy Chief of Staff, John Erzen, to provide applicants going forward to ensure no repurposing
- Many were programs for youth
  - Mentoring, music, interventions, apprenticeships, at-risk youth, school uniforms, STEM, childcare for infants and children with special needs, and before/after care etc.
- Other programs awarded were for elderly, food services/pantries, home improvements, classes/trainings, personal development, rent assistance, cancer support, etc.
- Communicate in Needs Assessment Forums to consider partnering to have larger impact

- o The Training Source
- Dr. Latimore discussed many of the applications and justified recommended funding
- Dr. Toye Latimore moved that the Local Development Council accept the applications as recommended for FY2024 grant funding
- Seconded by Delegate Turner
  - Will share revised application feedback report
